

SIZE AND SCOPE

Bristol Community College has an undergraduate population of 12,123 (unduplicated headcount of credit students for 2010-11) and 17,439 in noncredit enrollments.

STUDENT COSTS

Annual in-state tuition and fees: \$4,166

Annual out-of-state tuition and fees: \$9,482

Per credit charge of \$166 plus additional program-specific charges as applicable.

BUDGET

Bristol Community College's operating budget for Fiscal Year 2012 is \$62 million, including state support of \$13.9 million and \$21.9 million in federal, state, and private grants.

In FY11, more than \$22.3 million in federal, state, and local financial aid was disbursed to 5,980 students. In Fall 2011, 42% of students are receiving Pell Grants and 20% of students are receiving loans. The Bristol Community College Foundation awarded an additional \$99,235 in scholarships and awards to 264 recipients. The Foundation issued 141 loans totaling \$24,494 to assist students.

SUPPORTING AND RECOGNIZING VETERANS

With large numbers of veterans returning from Iraq and Afghanistan, Bristol Community College is gearing up to serve the special needs and concerns of veterans. Many are expected to take advantage of the Post 9/11 GI Bill. Through a Department of Labor grant, the College has established a Veterans Center to provide targeted advisement and career placement services for returning veterans. The staff help veterans and their families with paperwork, counseling, and other services directed at helping veterans use their benefits and move successfully into civilian life.

Dr. John J. Sbrega, himself a veteran of the Vietnam conflict, was recognized for his service to veterans and to the nation when he was named Veteran of the Year by the Veterans Transition House in New Bedford.

MISSION OF THE COLLEGE

As a leading resource for education and workforce development in southeastern Massachusetts, Bristol Community College provides programs that nurture the region's economic health and well-being and enable individuals to make productive life choices. These pro-
