SIZE AND SCOPE

Bristol Community College has an undergraduate population of 11,949 (unduplicated headcount of credit students for 2011-12) and 13,379 in noncredit enrollments.

STUDENT COSTS

Annual in-state tuition and fees: \$4,286 Annual out-of-state tuition and fees: \$9,602 Per credit charge of \$171 plus additional program-specific charges as applicable.

BUDGET

Bristol Community College's operating budget for Fiscal Year 2012 is \$62 million, including state support of \$13.6 million and \$29.5 million in federal, state, and private grants.

In FY12, more than \$24 million in federal, state, and local financial aid was disbursed to 6,266 students. In Fall 2012, 52% of students are receiving Pell Grants and 24% of students are receiving loans. The Bristol Community College Foundation awarded an additional \$154,503 in scholarships and awards to 234 recipients. The Foundation issued 139 loans totaling \$25,554 to assist students.

Nursing begins at eHealthCareers

When the doors opened at the BCC eHealthCareers building in downtown New Bedford, one thing became immediately clear: students in the Whaling City were eager for a Nursing option in their area. It was, and continued to be, the most discussed program at the 800 Purchase Street building on the campus. This September, that dream was finally realized as eHealth welcomed in the first New Bedford Nursing cohort. The project expands the number of Nursing students BCC can accept by 24 to directly address local healthcare workforce needs. To accommodate the new students, the College completed a brand new, 6,500 square foot "Nursing Suite" to house state-of-the-art labs, training space, classrooms, offices and a simulated pharmacy for

students in Nursing, Pharmacy Tech, and Phlebotomy.

eHealthCareers at BCC offers online-onsite healthcare programs in a format that fits the lives of the modern student. With more learning done online than in a traditional classroom, students who previously couldn't attend school due to time constraints are now able to enroll. The latest program additions at eHealth, including Nursing, Pharmacy Tech, and Central Sterile Technician, are directly meeting community workforce needs. BCC is forging new and expanded partnerships with local healthcare experts, including Southcoast Hospitals Groups, to stay on the cutting-edge of healthcare education.
