### **SIZE AND SCOPE**

Bristol Community College has an undergraduate population of **11,069** (unduplicated headcount of credit students for 2016-17) and **18,889** in non-credit enrollments.

Annual in-state tuition and fees: **\$4,730**Annual out-of-state tuition and fees: **\$9,674**

### BUDGET

Bristol Community College's operating budget for Fiscal Year 2018 is estimated at **\$74.5 million**, including state support of **\$21.2 million** and **\$29.5 million** in federal, state, and private grants.

In FY17, more than **\$26.1 million** in federal, state, and local financial aid was disbursed to **6,594** students. In Fall 2017, **46%** of students are receiving Pell Grants and **26%** of students are receiving loans.

The Bristol Community College Foundation awarded **\$185,758** in scholarships and awards to **290** recipients. The Foundation issued **108** loans totaling **\$27,755** to assist students.
