ASSESSMENT: CAS REVIEW (YEAR TWO) DUE DATE: JUNE 30TH

The Goal: We must document the significance, value, and contributions student services makes toward the institution's mission and goals. In order to accomplish this, building a culture of evidence that demonstrate the learning taking place within the experiences provided becomes a significant aspect of accomplishing better practices to deepen, adjust, and correct if needed, the co-curricular student experience. We do this by examining the work being done, determining the effectiveness of the work, and the impact it has on student learning. Critical questions to answer by way of evidence:

- Do the spaces we create for students impact them in ways that contribute to their success?
- What are students learning (and does the learning align with learning outcomes, division competencies and the institution mission/strategic objectives?

Part 4-CAS Assessment:

The CAS Review cycle incorporates sections of functional area standards and guidelines. There is a total of 11 sections. Self-assessment guides (SAGs) are used as a tool to assist in operationalizing the assessment work. Section 4 of the CAS Review focuses on Assessment efforts.

Execute Assessment Findings:

This deliverable gives staff the opportunity to dive deeper into CAS review given their SMART Goals and assessment findings. This is an area of the review where each department can focus on specific areas of inquiry and assessment initiatives.

SMART Goals:

Strategic, Measurable, Attainable, Relatable, Timing (SMART) goals are measurable statements that specifically focus on a particular outcome. SMART goals aren't necessarily learning outcomes. They are often used when setting up objectives and tasks to be completed.

Step One:

Familiarize yourself with the website section on Year One deliverables, resources, templates, and instructions.

Plan at least two SMART goals for next year

- One must be directly related to the improvement of student learning
- One must be directly related to equity-minded practice
- One must be directly related to the CAS self-assessment (If it is determined that an area needs to be further investigated)
